Importance of Political Stability in Myanmar


- 2015 Election results may change Myanmar policies
- Suspension of Sino-Myanmar projects due to civilian protests
- Civil war problems near Sino-Myanmar borders





Traditional Sino-Myanmar Relations

- Friendly neighbors with 2,200 km long borderlines
- China was a strong backer of Myanmar during the days of Western sanctions
- China has been the largest foreign investor in Myanmar







Traditional Sino-Myanmar Relations

- Relationship come to a downhill since Myanmar's open policy to the West
- Project suspensions further deteriorate relationships
- China starts to reach out to opposition party leader to maintain political balance
